Celebrating Eid Al Adha

Eid-Al-Adha ('Festival of Sacrifice'), also known as the Greater Eid, is the second festival in the Muslim calendar, after Eid Al Fitr, but considered the most important. It is celebrated at the end of the 'Hajj', the annual pilgrimage to Mecca. The Eid is a public holiday and lasts for three days. This year it is expected to begin on or around September 23, depending on the sighting of the new moon.


During the celebrations, Muslims remember and commemorate one of Ibrahim's (Abraham's) main trials, when God appeared to Ibrahim in a dream and asked him to sacrifice his son as an act of obedience. As Ibrahim was all prepared to do it, God stopped him and gave him a ram to sacrifice instead. Today, Muslims commemorate and remember Ibrahim's trials, by themselves slaughtering an animal, usually a sheep or a goat. The meat from the sacrifice is mostly given away to others. One-third is eaten by immediate family and relatives, one-third is given away to friends, and one-third is shared with the poor. The act symbolizes the willingness to give up things that are close to our hearts, in order to follow God's commands

The day of Eid starts with Muslims going to the Mosque for prayers, dressed in their best/new clothes. It is also a time when they visit family and friends as well as offering gifts to children. The best way to greet your Muslim friends on this special day is simply by saying Eid Mubarak.
